I am a therapist in Ashland Oregon and have been practicing for 15 years.

Insurance audits are abusive and unfair and limit access to care to the people of Oregon. Please help stop this practice.

As a therapist that finds importance in my clients being able to use their insurance to cover the cost of therapy, I have endured the stress and abuse by insurance companies. I have at times come close to moving to cash pay only as it would require a lot less time and reduce stress for me, but I keep allowing insurance as payment because so many people are not able to pay out of pocket, and there is an immense need for mental health therapy. I have seen so many therapists move to cash pay only as they just are unable to manage the demands of insurance companies and medicaid, etc. By supporting this bill you help to ensure providers like myself continue to receive insurance as payment. Currently, insurance companies put demands on audits that are not clear and clawback thousands of dollars without notice.
