While we may not always have agreed politically, I have always enjoyed my various encounters with Peter. He was old-school tough, and he was a very competent, trustworthy politician and political leader.

The last issue that I felt privileged to work on with Peter was the Capitol Master Plan for renovation and seismic upgrading of this building. I had gotten involved as a staffer in 2005 and as the Building Committee Chair of the Oregon State Capitol Foundation. Peter was a supporter and tried repeatedly to secure funding for the project. At one point, he proposed that in order to gain approval, he and I might go on the road together, he as the Democrat political leader and me as the Republican civilian taxpayer. I'm sorry we didn't get to do that. Funding for the project and the project itself became more complicated. Eventually, and with a different approach, the project has been funded, and we will all enjoy the final result early next year. I honestly don't know if the project would yet be underway without Peter Courtney's leadership.

Peter's list of accomplishments, both in and out of politics, is lengthy. I'm sure you will hear about many of them today. Oregon is better today because of his leadership and the support he received from Margie and their kids. We all miss him. Please pass SCR 10.
