Measure, Appointment or Topic: HB3075

As a citizen of the state of Oregon, I am adamantly opposed to House Bill 3075. This bill does nothing to improve or address public safety. Rather it infringes on the rights of lawful firearms owners. It is unreasonably burdensome with no mechanism to lawfully purchase or possess firearms and firearm related equipment that complies with all Federal Firearms laws, which are protected by the 2nd Amendment of the US constitution.

Federal rulings have already addressed sections of this bill and have ruled them unconstitutional.

In addressing gun violence this state has adequate and enforceable laws to address unlawful possession and use of firearms. This fact along with the common sense conclusion that criminals do not comply with the law, this bill will not prevent this segment of society and the criminal conduct. It would be the same as punishing lawful drivers who committed no offenses for the actions of drunk drivers.
