I respectfully submit this testimony in opposition of HB 3075 and continuing opposition to Measure 114. It appears to me that insanity is about to happen-AGAIN. This nation has some 20,000+ existing laws and regulations regarding all aspects of firearms, and yet, accidents continue to happen, and crime and criminals continue to exist and use firearms in all manner of criminal acts.
