"Oregon HB 3075 represents a blatant attack on the fundamental Second Amendment rights of law-abiding citizens. This bill, like the deeply flawed Measure 114 it seeks to bolster, demonstrates a profound disregard for the Second Amendment and the principles upon which our nation was founded. This legislation creates a maze of bureaucratic hurdles designed to deter and obstruct the exercise of a constitutionally protected right.

HB3075 represents a blatant circumvention of established legal processes and a dangerous erosion of our constitutional rights. The invocation of an emergency declaration, absent any genuine crisis in Oregon, is a gross abuse of executive power and sets a perilous precedent for future infringements on our Second Amendment liberties. We will not tolerate the weaponization of emergency powers to bypass due process and undermine our fundamental rights.

Infringement on the Right to Bear Arms:

- The extended 60-day processing period for firearm purchase permits is an egregious delay, effectively denying individuals their right to self-defense.
 This delay is unacceptable and unconstitutional.
- The increased fees associated with permit applications and renewals impose an undue financial burden on citizens, particularly those from lower-income communities, creating a de facto poll tax on a constitutional right.

Targeting Law-Abiding Citizens:

- This legislation does nothing to address the root causes of crime. Instead, it punishes law-abiding gun owners with unnecessary regulations and restrictions. Criminals will continue to obtain firearms through illegal channels, while responsible citizens are left vulnerable.
- The requirement that legal challenges be filed in Marion County is a clear attempt to limit the legal recourse available to those who wish to defend their constitutional rights.

• The Second Amendment is Non-Negotiable:

- The Second Amendment is not a privilege to be granted or revoked by the government. It is an inherent right that protects the ability of citizens to defend themselves, their families, and their communities. HB 3075 disregards this fundamental principle.
- Backdating the law is a "Ex post facto" and is illegal.
