I write to voice my fierce opposition to Measure 114, a law so flawed and misguided it shames Oregon and every freedom-loving American. Practically, it's a mess. Ending the three-day background check limit turns a right into a waiting game, leaving people vulnerable for weeks. The cost? An estimated \$51 million in year one, draining taxpayers for a law with no proven benefit. It's fiscal madness.

Worse, it's a step toward disarmament. Grandfathering magazines but banning them in public is nonsense, a test for broader bans. Rural Oregonians reject this elitism, with sheriffs refusing enforcement and courts mired in fights as of March 2025. It empowers criminals, endangers families, and mocks the Constitution.

Measure 114 isn't a fix—it's a symptom of a government drunk on control, blind to reality, and deaf to its people. It dodges real issues—mental illness, gangs, despair—and hammers the innocent. I demand its repeal. Fight this travesty, defend Oregon's soul, and declare: we won't be disarmed. This is about liberty, and we must not let it slip.
