I do transportation work in Gresham, Oregon and see first-hand the benefit these micromobility devices for all people, especially low-income communities. E-bikes provide a low-cost, reliable transportation option for Oregonians, reducing household expenses on gas, car maintenance, and transit fares. A subsidy would make e-bikes accessible to more people, particularly low-income residents who need affordable mobility options to get to work, school, and essential services.
