Measure, Appointment or Topic: HB3075

While an attempt to fix measure 114, HB3075 only continues to exacerbate the problems with it. As is often said, a right delayed is a right denied. HB3075 only serves to increase the processing time for a permit up to 60 days for those attempting to exercise their constitutional right. In addition, it unduly burdens those of economic hardship by increasing the cost of a permit to \$150. Not only does it add additional cost, it does not resolve any of the issues of allowing local police the right to deny anyone a permit at their discretion. Even if an appeals process is defined, that will add months to the process for an applicant. The right to self defense is protected by both the state and federal constitution, but HB3075 substantially hinders that right for the most vulnerable Oregonians.
