As a fiscally conservative citizen and constitutionalist, I strongly oppose House Bill 3075. This bill expands government overreach by modifying Ballot Measure 114, imposing burdensome permit requirements and fees—up to \$150 for initial applications and \$110 for renewals—on law-abiding Oregonians exercising their Second Amendment rights. The Constitution guarantees my right to keep and bear arms, and this legislation tramples that liberty with unnecessary bureaucracy and costs, all while exempting public records disclosure, reducing transparency.

I believe in limited government that respects individual freedoms, not one that penalizes citizens for exercising their rights. HB 3075's delays (60 days for permit processing) and training mandates infringe on my autonomy and add financial strain, contradicting fiscal responsibility.
