

To whom it may concern,

I am submitting official notice of my opposition to HB 3075. This bill will restrict Constitutional firearms ownership in Oregon even more than Measure 114. Measure 114 barely passed by less than half a percent and is currently pending appeal to the Oregon Supreme Court. These facts reflect Oregonians lack of alignment regarding increasing firearms ownership or magazine restrictions – especially to the extent as expanded upon in HB 3075.

The increased fees, expanded permit process, and stricter eligibility requirements detailed in HB 3075 serve to further restrict firearms ownership to law-abiding citizens in a way that is unreflective of Oregon's traditions and culture.

HB 3075 will do nothing to curtail gun-related crimes. Criminals willing to violate the law by partaking in criminal behavior will not choose to obey the law when it comes to firearms procurement. Therefore, HB 3075 unduly and unjustly serves to delay the rights of law-abiding citizens and restricts the rights of socioeconomically disadvantaged Oregonians by increasing the time-period and fiduciary hurdles for firearms ownership.

Due to the above, as a citizen of Beaverton, Oregon, I submit my statement of opposition to HB 3075.
