Re: Opposition for HB 3875 – Data in Motor Vehicles

Dear Chair Sosa:

The Alliance for Automotive Innovation<sup>1</sup> opposes HB 3875 which creates a new requirement under the current privacy law.

This bill would amend Oregon's comprehensive privacy law to eliminate the existing volume-based exemption for small automakers and affiliates. As far as we can determine, there is no demonstrated need for amending the law to remove the exemption. It is unclear why small automakers and their affiliates should be treated any differently than other entities under Oregon law. The rationale for the current legal exemption holds for these small automakers as it does for any other low-volume data entity.

For these reasons, the Alliance for Automotive Innovation opposes HB 3875.
