Please do not punish the vast majority of law-abiding Oregonians that currently own magazines with greater than 10 rounds, which could make them unexpectedly criminals in many cases in the future, as it is impractical to meet all the requirements to prove they have a right to have them. Further, it makes it unnecessarily burdensome or even impossible to use many models of guns that they already own. The entire section of the bill entitled "Large Capacity Magazines" needs to be removed or at least improved in a future bill.

I do appreciate the fact that HB3075 prohibits records from the permit-to-purchase process from becoming public, one of the most egregious violations of personal rights in Measure 114. However, even as modified in HB3075, this bill simply adds another layer of unnecessary government red tape, delays, reasons for lawsuits, and most importantly undue burden on law-abiding citizens for what is clearly a Constitutional right. We have laws and background checks that prevent criminals from obtaining guns, already! Oregon law enforcement needs to concentrate their over-burdened resources on existing laws and preventing crimes related to gangs and drugs, by far the most significant sources of gun violence.
