A more holistic approach could provide greater long-term benefits for indigenous language preservation and revitalization, rather than merely funding interpretation services.

In conclusion, while the intention behind HB 2976 to support indigenous languages is commendable, I urge you to reconsider the approach taken in this bill. It is essential to prioritize accountability, community involvement, and comprehensive strategies that truly reflect the needs of indigenous peoples. I encourage you to advocate for a more thoughtful and inclusive plan that supports the preservation of these vital languages.
