Measure, Appointment or Topic: HB3075

As a concerned Oregonian, I oppose HB3075 because it lacks a fiscal impact statement, leaving taxpayers uncertain about its true cost. This bill modifies firearm permit rules from Ballot Measure 114 by doubling permit fees and extending processing times from 30 to 60 days, creating unnecessary burdens for law-abiding citizens while likely increasing demands on the Oregon State Police. Without a clear fiscal analysis, we can only speculate on the financial impact—higher administrative costs, more staff time, and no guarantee of improved safety. Responsible legislation requires transparency, yet HB3075 moves forward without proving it won't drain public resources. Oregonians deserve accountability, not unchecked spending disguised as reform.
