Oregon's Measure 114 is a blatant violation of the 2nd Amendment of the US Constitution.

As a Husband and Father, I strongly oppose this measure. This measure puts roadblocks and diminishes my ability to protect my family, myself, and my community. This measure will vilify those who are most able and willing to protect the lives of their fellow citizens and will embolden those who will not follow the law. Furthermore, this measure will continue to cost Oregonians as the Governor and her staff will continue to spend millions of dollars fighting to install an unconstitutional mandate that is ultimately headed for defeat in either state or federal Supreme Court challenge. This measure succeeds only in creating a further divide amongst those who train and strive to protect others by carrying firearms lawfully and those who purport to want 'reasonable gun laws' while continually demonizing the former. This measure must, and will, be struck down.

Some additional points:
