The permitting process proposed in this bill not only creates unnecessary bureaucratic hurdles but also has the potential to disenfranchise certain individuals from their right to firearm ownership. By imposing additional regulations that could be selectively enforced or financially restrictive, this bill risks making legal firearm ownership inaccessible to some Oregonians—especially those in rural communities and lower-income households.

This bill does little to address crime and instead targets those who exercise their constitutional rights responsibly.
