Dear Chair Nosse, Vice-Chairs Javadi and Nelson, and Members of the Committee,

I urge your strong strong support for House Bill 2203, which aims to improve workplace safety and support for behavioral health professionals.

HB 2203 makes essential improvements to Oregon's Behavioral Health system by addressing the recommendations of the Joint Task Force on Improving the Safety of Behavioral Health Workers.
