HB3075

House Bill 3075 amends Ballot Measure 114 in ways that Oregonians never voted for. Measure 114 still has ongoing legal challenges, but that's not stopping Democrats from charging ahead to implement the law. Here is what the bill does:
Infringement on YOUR Rights: HB 3075 jacks up permit fees to buy a firearm by 130% and increases purchase waiting periods from 30 to 60 days.
