My name is B.F., and I am writing in strong support of SB 722 and SB 611 to advocate for rent stabilization and fair housing policies that protect Oregon renters from unchecked rent increases and corporate landlord practices.

Rent increases consistently outpace wage growth, making it increasingly difficult for working families to afford stable housing. Additionally, this bill will prohibit the use of price-fixing AI software that has been used to manipulate rent prices, making housing even less accessible for renters. SB 611 further strengthens rent caps to prevent excessive and destabilizing rent hikes that force people out of their homes and communities.

Oregon must take action to protect its residents from the exploitative practices of large corporate landlords and create a fairer housing market for all. I urge you to pass SB 722 and SB 611 to ensure that renters are not left at the mercy of unchecked rent increases and corporate greed.
