My name is **Shaun Franks**, and I am the **Sales and Marketing Coordinator** at **True South Solar**. I am writing to express my strong support for **HB 3747**, which would create a **refundable solar and storage tax credit**, making solar energy more accessible to Oregonians of all income levels.

My journey in solar began in **2010**, when **Southern Oregon University (SOU)** sent me to **Germany** to study renewable energy. Energy policy plays a crucial role in **Oregon's long-term sustainability**, and we must continue to support renewable energy while providing real solutions to rising energy costs and climate uncertainty.
