But if we made it Oregon Youth Suicide Awareness Day, it can be a day full of hope, and a chance to remind this state of who we have lost, and the struggles the youth of today are facing. The creation of this bill allows my peers and I to know that people are taking this seriously, adults do notice it, and these issues are being addressed.
