


Why is reform needed?

Oregon's closed primary system . . .


- Disenfranchises 43% voters
 - NAVs 4x rate Ds/Rs since 2016 diverse, younger voters
- Inhibits competition
- Limits voter choice
- Skews election results

Oregon 2022 primary: cumulative percentage of ballots cast by age










Ranked-choice voting became partisan in 2024 - and failed



Pro-democracy-reform vote ran 5 points behind Democratic vote share


Most proposals included ranked-choice voting Exceptions: repeal (Alaska), all-party primaries (Montana), redistricting reform (Ohio)

Fusion Voting – Minor Parties influence elections, policy Protect Democracy "Fusion Voting and a Revitalized Role for Minor Parties in Presidential Elections" 12/14/23

Unified Primary Act key provisions:

Opens closed partisan primaries - enfranchises 43% non-affiliated voters

All voters participate fully and equally in the primary election. Increases voter participation.

Promotes fair competition

- Requires candidates to fairly compete head-to-head on the <u>same</u> primary ballot
- Equalizes filing requirements; allows diverse candidates & minor parties to advance

Broadens voter choice

- Top-2+ advance from primary to general election
 - + minor party nominations, candidates who gather signatures to qualify for general ballot
- Enables fusion candidates & minor parties to fairly compete; allows up to 3 endorsements
- Elects leaders who are accountable to broader coalitions of voters
