Measure 114, Oregon's latest gun law, is a misguided attempt to reduce gun violence. By requiring a permit to purchase firearms, imposing a 30-day waiting period, and banning magazines holding more than 10 rounds, this law infringes upon the constitutional rights of law-abiding citizens.
