Dog Coalition, New Democrat Coalition and was ranked the most bipartisan House member for Oregon. I support open primary reform (HB 3166-2) because open primaries

elect leaders who work across the aisle to solve big problems and represent broader coalitions of voters. I support letting all registered Oregon voters vote in a unified primary,

the Unified Primary Act (HB 3166-2) as a foundational democracy reform.

Closed partisan primaries decided by a small percentage of voters are fueling extremism

both nationally and in Oregon. "Just 8% of the U.S. voting age population effectively elected 83% of the U.S. House in partisan primaries. The result is that elected officials are

not accountable to the vast majority of voters, which rewards extremism, fuels division,

and distorts representation. Letting nonaffiliated voters vote in an open primary is the most

impactful democracy reform to improve voter turnout and decrease polarization, according to research.

I support the Unified Primary Act (HB 3166-2) to let all registered Oregon voters vote in

state-funded primary elections, as a foundational democracy reform
