RE: Senate Joint Resolution 28

Chair Jama, Vice-Chair Bonham, Committee Members:

I want to express my strong support for Senate Joint Resolution 28, which proposes to amend the Oregon Constitution to establish <u>a fundamental right to a clean, safe, and healthy environment</u>. With an educational background in biology and science education, I am aware of the relationship between ecosystems and their impacts on human health, and believe this amendment is needed to ensure Oregon's future and quality of life.

Environmental Rights and Good Governance

First, <u>the proposed amendment aligns with global trends in environmental governance</u>. The United Nations Environment Program has recognized **the importance of environmental rule of law** since 2013, <u>acknowledging that violations of environmental law can undermine sustainable development</u>.
