Measure, Appointment or Topic: HB3075

I am against HB 3075-1. This is just a guise for gun confiscation. There was a joint meeting of the Senate and House Committees on Judiciary held on 13 March 2025. There were many speakers that were anti-Second Amendment but, there were none from the NRA, OFF, and other Second Amendment organizations. This informational meeting was one sided and is the prelude to the public hearings on 17 March.

On 17 March 2025 there was a public hearing where a Dr. Daniel Webster a Bloomberg professor of American Health. His primary research interests include the prevention of gun violence, gun policy, gun acquisition. This is also a 1 - sided purported expert. Who paid for his travel expenses? What funded him? Was it the Oregon taxpayer?

Cease Fire Oregon testified that gun deaths out numbered fentanyl deaths without presenting any facts. A student testified without presenting any facts and her Mother had worked for Governor Kate Brown. Several testified from the red shirt brigade without any facts. Tragedies of accidents which adults could have prevented with proper gun storage. One testified that it was the guns fault that her brother committed a Robbery for the second time. Several people cited that ballot measure #114 was constitutional when there are several challenges winding their way through the courts.

Several gun control advocates said that ballot measure #114 was the will of the people when it passed by 2% and had a confusing summary as a gun safety law instead of a gun control measure. Example: Light rail to the PDX airport was turned down 2 times by the voters, Drivers licenses for undocumented workers was turned down by the voters and the legislature passed a bill allowing it..
