I am a registered nurse for Hillsboro School District. I am also a member of Oregon's Traumatic Brain Injury Team and a developer of the TBI process for our district. I fully support broadening the immediate temporary accommodations plan to include socioemotional and physical accommodations in addition to academic accommodations put forth by HB4140. Brain dysfunction affects all areas of a person's life. Socioemotional accommodations can ease the burden on children struggling with emotional regulation, withdrawal from others due to lost social skills, and depression/grief. Physical accommodations are equally important. Elevator keys, sunglasses, and noise cancelling headphones can make the difference between attending and not attending school.

The last point I want to bring up is that the 5-day time frame (notification of the school to plan implementation) is necessary to make sure TBI plans are in place to support students when they need it. Before I was a nurse, I was a science teacher. I know just how full my classroom was with students and how my to-do list never ended. Each school day was a flurry of activity. Some educators, counselors, and school nurses need the additional push to get plans in place promptly. Please help us in this by passing HB3007.
