

Residential Programs Closures Since 2015

Below is a list of residential programs that have closed their doors since 2015. Some programs were small and had a capacity of just 2 or 3 residential beds, while others were much larger with a capacity of 25 to 30; they also covered a range of specialized services for vulnerable children and youth, ranging from pregnant and parenting teens, to LGBTQIA+ youth, to Native American youth. In total, conservatively these programs represent at least 275 to 300 lost residential beds over 9-years. The list does not include programs that reduced their number of beds but remained open.
