I strongly oppose HB 3166 and HB 3166-2.

In fact, I strongly oppose any future possible amendments to HB 3166 / HB 3166-2 that may occur without my knowledge after submitting this written testimony. There is NO way HB 3166 / HB 3166-2 could be improved. The bill and its amendment are terrible. And they are contrary to the American Principle of Representation.

Ranked-choice voting not only ignores/violates the true Principle of Representation, it causes:

- frustration
- no allowance for voters to choose a singular individual whom they truly want to elect
- the ability to manipulate votes via "strategic voting"
- false wins
