Honorable Chair Prozanski and Members of the Senate Committee on Judiciary. As a sanctuary state Oregon stands for the safety, dignity and human rights of all of its

residents. I am writing in support of SB 703, providing grants to nonprofits to help immigrants

improve their legal status.

I have been working with families from Afghanistan helping them learn English. I have become very attached to a lovely family of six here in Eugene. They are polite, kind, cultured, educated professional parents with motivated children to be highly educated. They enrich my life every time I'm with them by how thankful they are to be here, especially in Oregon. They will one day be very productive citizens given the support and help they need while they are learning English.

Many people who would want to improve their status are hindered by the cost this would entail.

The rules around immigration law are well-known to be Byzantine in their complexity and

working through such documentation requires much work and with the aid of a lawyer. The

cost of applying for citizenship is over \$1000 with lawyer's fees on top of that, making application for citizenship or other improvements in immigrant status prohibitive for many

people. Some of the expense of this program to the state will be offset by documentation that

will allow immigrants to apply for federal programs if needed, and so reducing costs to the

state. The nonprofits, to whom this program being proposed in SB 703, would have to verify

their work, being required to report on the success of their grants.

There are good reasons to raise the experience of immigrant families, many of whom have

been working, raising their children and paying taxes in this state for many, many years. These

improvements for them would help create healthy families by further providing them with

access to good work and healthcare for themselves and for their children. This frees them from

fear, making them able to carry out their lives as any other person in the state is privileged to

do. Helping families to stabilize their lives through proper documentation will have benefits

beyond their immediate selves, creating more productive conditions for business and commerce in the state through a more secure, dependable workforce, a workforce that has

become essential to our state economy. We cannot leave these deserving people behind. They

merit our respect as Oregonians and for the hard work they do every day in our communities. I

strongly urge you to support SB 703.
