I was signed up to provide this testimony virtually in today's hearing, but time ran out before my name was called. Thank you for accepting my written testimony.

Good afternoon, Chair and members of the committee. My name is Jeana Frazzini. I am a resident of North Portland House District 43. I unequivocally support HB 3076. This is a commonsense policy aimed at keeping crime guns out of our communities. I have two children who attended Portland Public Schools, family members and dear friends who work in the schools. I have experienced the fear and dread of sending my beloveds to school in the midst of an epidemic of gun violence. In my oldest son's senior year of high school, three of his classmates were shot to death at a local park. I've lived in my neighborhood for 28 years and have had to grab my kids and hit the floor more times than I care to count as gunfire rang out. Six years ago, we awoke to over 55 shots being fired from multiple guns in the alley behind our home, many struck houses nearby.

When I learned that my favorite taco truck is regulated and inspected more rigorously than gun dealerships in this state, I was stunned.

When I learned that a barber can get fined for having hair in the drawer at their shop, but you can't get fined for having an unsecured firearm in a gun dealership, I was angry.

When I learned that the ATF inspects only 2% of dealers in Oregon, I knew I had to speak up and that "the state" – all of you and all of us – must step up.

Please pass HB 3076 to keep crime guns out of our communities. Our kids and our neighbors are counting on you. Thank you.
