The bill would put an extreme financial burden on firearms dealers with the proposed fees, insurance and security requirements. Firearms dealers are currently licensed federally, and in order to receive a Federal Firearms License (FFL) they must submit photographs, fingerprints and personal information to pass a federal background check. The proposed state license would be a duplication of this process and a duplication of fees. The insurance and security requirements would be financially impossible for most dealers. Other than the financial cost, the security requirements will also have a negative impact on customer foot traffic--many customers will not want to shop where they are being monitored by video and audio. The bill would put a burden on law-abiding dealers and customers, and criminals will continue to steal firearms or purchase them on the black market.
