On behalf of the Oregon Alliance of Children's Programs, I am writing to express strong support for ODHS Budget (SB 5526) Policy Option Package (POP) 112 requesting funds to PREVENT children from being placed in Foster Care.

ODHS is requesting \$7 million in this POP. These state funds will be matched 1:1 by the federal government for an overall investment of \$14 million. The federal match is organized under the Family First Prevention Services Act (FFPSA), a transformative piece of bipartisan legislation that improves the lives of children and families across the country.

FFPSA restructures federal funding to prioritize prevention services—such as in-home parenting programs, mental health care, and substance use treatment—allowing families to access critical resources before foster care placement becomes necessary. This shift represents a long-overdue investment in family preservation, recognizing that children do best when raised in stable, loving environments. Additionally, FFPSA promotes family-based placements over institutional settings, ensuring that foster care remains a temporary and supportive solution rather than a long-term disruption to a child's life.

With nearly half a million children in foster care today across the country and an increasing number of families affected by the opioid crisis, the need for comprehensive, evidence-based support is more urgent than ever.

It is essential that federal and state agencies work together to maximize a prevention focused impact. I urge you to support Policy Option Package (POP) 112 requesting funds to prevent children from being placed in Foster Care within ODHS's budget (SB 5526).
