My wife and I have read the many studies from dry Western lands that show the extremely valuable results when beavers are allowed to build dams in streams. Ranchers are aided by more water in the middle of summer as well as more cow feed. Recreation like fishing and bird watching is greatly improved = fun and tourist dollars. Water tables are increased, broadened out, making wells more reliable. Water and green vegetation form excellent fire breaks in this time of increasing range fires. Beaver constructed wetlands also reduce flood crests whenever heavy rains do occur. Also, soil erosion is greatly reduced. Beaver can damage high value trees near homesteads but this is easily deterred by wrapping trees with web wire - like my family has done.
