support of HB 3932, a common sense bill pending in the Oregon Legislature that prioritizes improving water quality in Oregon streams by protecting beavers.

HB 3932 would temporarily close beaver trapping where they are needed most: on waters the Oregon Department of Environmental Quality has determined have "impaired" water quality. Nearly one-third of Oregon's stream miles are listed as impaired, contending with elevated water temperatures and high levels of sedimentation, toxins or other pollutants. Research has shown that beavers are incredibly effective at improving water quality—if we leave them in peace to do their work.
