<u>What We Want</u>: I request you <u>invest in</u> DHS - including SEIU Local 99 care providers' competitive wages and current/additional work hours, current consumer/client SNAP allotments, Community Action, Sequoia Mental Health, LifeWorks Mental Health, and Department of Housing Services' <u>budgets</u>.

These agencies and provider hours ensure survival for my consumer clients. Without <u>both</u> economic supports and care providing hours, those we serve would be living on the street – a greatly expensive and dangerous social burden to society.

HB 5006: Invest a Socio-Eco System enabling care providers to successfully evolve consumer/clients to a level of self-sufficiency.

**SB 538A:** Cause ODHS to pay parents to provide in-home care/ attendant care services for minor children with developmental disabilities who have very high behavioral health or medical needs.

HB 3193: Invest in farm laborers: Create a relief program to provide money to farmworkers who have lost income due to a disaster through the Oregon Health Authority establishing and implementing a permanent farmworker disaster relief program.
