I have lived in Oregon since 1978. Being an animal lover and nature lover since childhood, I've paid special attention to beavers and their amazing life styles.

Historically, Oregon was named "the Beaver State", for its green valleys, meadows, and forests, created and supported by these industrious little creatures. Oregon now is a far cry from that rich green, water filled environment of those days as beavers were trapped and hunted, almost annihilated, for their pelts. The moist rich landscape was drastically changed. Moist rich meadows and valleys dried up and water, no longer held by the work of beavers, rushed down stream causing erosion and flooding below.
