Chair Jama, Vice Chair Bonham, and members of the Senate Committee on Rules:

Oregon citizens should be provided the opportunity to vote on their right to a clean, healthy environment. I urge you to approve SJR28 and support Oregonian's right to vote on a proposed Oregon Constitutional Amendment establishing the right to a clean and healthy environment.

I lie awake at night worrying about what the future holds for my children, grandchildren, and all future generations.
