Measure, Appointment or Topic:	SB1153

SB 1153 threatens Oregon's ability to manage water efficiently and responsibly. It ignores existing public review requirements currently required in OWRD's water rights transfer process. By adding more layers of bureaucratic review, the bill would have a chilling effect on the efficient use of water throughout our state through the threat of litigation from activist third parties.

This bill would severely restrict water users' ability to adapt to changing conditions by imposing vague and broad environmental assessments. SB 1153 would also open the door to years-long delays and costly litigation from third parties without improving environmental protections. SB 1153 adds new, duplicative standards to a process already governed by strict anti-injury and anti-enlargement rules.

The Oregon Water Resources Department is already stretched thin—this bill would add to an already overburdened system for no benefit to anyone. Not the environment, not state agencies, and certainly not for agriculture!
