We specialize in growing single-cut, premium-quality heirloom Black Mitcham Peppermint, known for its exceptional flavor and aroma in tea leaf and essential oil production.

Almost 20 years ago, our journey took an unexpected turn when the domestic mint market faced a significant downturn. With prices falling and demand shifting, we were forced to rethink the future of our farm. That challenge led us to diversify into candy production, using our premium mint to create peppermint patties and other confections. What began as a way to adapt has since grown into a thriving business, with our peppermint patties now enjoyed by customers across the country and around the world.

Expanding into candy manufacturing and national/international markets was no small task. We had to learn new production processes, navigate regulatory requirements, and identify potential buyers—an overwhelming prospect for a small, family-run operation. Fortunately, the Oregon Department of Agriculture (ODA) stepped in as a vital resource, helping us every step of the way.

The team at ODA provided invaluable guidance on market development, trade opportunities, and export logistics. Their expertise in connecting Oregon food producers with domestic and international buyers opened doors that would have been difficult, if not impossible, to access on our own. Through their support, we were able to participate in trade shows, gain exposure in key markets, and take advantage of programs that helped offset the costs of growing our business.
