2. Some predator species can negatively impact populations of game animals, such as deer and elk, affecting ecosystem balance and hunting opportunities.

3. Certain predators, (cougars and bears) pose risks to public safety, particularly in rural and suburban areas.

LCPDs assist in managing populations to reduce dangerous encounters.

4. While predators play an essential role in ecosystems, their populations must be managed in certain areas to prevent imbalances that could lead to declines in prey species or increased human-wildlife conflicts.

5. LCPDs ensure management practices follow state and federal guidelines, utilizing humane and science-based methods for population control, deterrence, and mitigation.
