# Support for HB 3366 -Rogue Siskiyou Regional Wildfire Training Center

## The Urgent Need for HB 3366

- Wildfire Crisis in Oregon: In 2023, 1,956 fires burned nearly 2 million acres, costing the state over \$350 million.
- Lack of Trained Firefighters: Oregon had to import wildfire fighters from Australia and New Zealand due to workforce shortages.
- **Unquantifiable Losses:** Lives, property, salmon stocks, and wildlife have been devastated by fires.

## What HB 3366 Will Do

- Construct the Rogue Siskiyou Regional Wildfire Training Center (RSR) in Curry County.
- Oregon's First Wildfire Training Facility: Capable of graduating up to 1,500 wildfire cadets annually.
- Nationally Premier Training Site: Located in rugged terrain ideal for training elite wildfire fighters.
- Year-Round Firefighter Retention: Off-season fuel reduction crews will help prevent future wildfires.

#### Additional Benefits of RSR

- **Southern Oregon Wildfire Command Center:** Supports rapid response hand crews to stop fires before they spread.
- Emergency Support Hub: Provides food, shelter, and resources for both firefighters and wildfire victims.
- **Boosts Fire Insurance Stability:** Helps prevent more insurance carriers from leaving the state.
