On behalf of Tongue Point Job Corps Center (TPJCC), I am writing to express our strong support for Senate Bill 460, sponsored by Senator Weber and Representative Javadi. This proposed legislation represents an important step in expanding opportunities for pre-apprenticeship participants, including our Job Corps students, by exempting them from prevailing wage requirements on public works projects. At TPJCC, our mission is to prepare young adults for high-demand careers, with a strong emphasis on skilled trades and construction industry pathways. A key component of our training involves placing students in critical internship roles that provide them with hands-on experience and industry exposure. However, the current prevailing wage requirements create barriers to securing these placements, as many employers are unable to take on pre-apprentices without incurring unsustainable labor costs.

By amending ORS 279C.810 to exempt pre-apprenticeship participants from prevailing wage laws, Senate Bill 460 will:

• Increase access to real-world training opportunities for our students.

• Strengthen partnerships with local employers, unions, and contractors who need skilled workers.

• Position Job Corps graduates for placements in union apprenticeships and construction industry jobs throughout Oregon and southern Washington.

• Help address the skilled labor shortage in the region by ensuring a steady pipeline of trained, job-ready workers.

This legislation aligns with workforce development goals and will provide a direct benefit to Oregon's construction industry, public works projects, and economic growth. By removing obstacles to pre-apprenticeship placements, Senate Bill 460 ensures that our students have the opportunity to gain essential trade skills, secure union placements, and contribute to vital infrastructure projects in our communities.
