- Secondary CTE Career Pathways Grants
- CTE Revitalization Grants
- CTSO Student Leadership Center Grant

As a student who served as an Oregon FFA State Officer from 2023–2024, I saw the impact that FFA and CTE had on both me and members across the state. I heard stories about members who only joined FFA because of the resources and support it provides, increased chapter involvement because of the funding and grants available, and the growth and experience FFA provides for all students.
