I am writing to urge you to prioritize protecting and investing in Oregon's climate progress and to work to guard against federal chaos. Please support continued funding for existing, popular state programs to cut climate pollution, drive clean economic growth and promote community resilience.

And in any budget, please prioritize funding to support our state energy and natural resource agencies in advancing Oregon's climate goals, ensuring healthy, resilient communities, and supporting clean energy job growth across Oregon. Also, I urge you to maintain adequate funding to ensure agencies are adequately resourced to effectively implement existing climate programs and policies, including our Climate Protection Program and 100% Clean Energy law.

Please prioritize a state budget that protects our climate and our communities rather than adding to the chaos.
