My issues with my insecurities with food benefits/ snap benefits started back in 1973 when I moved to Oregon from Illinois and was living with my sister. I've been struggling with having adequate food to feed myself and family ever since was An young Adult at age of eighteen in 1976, I am a firm believer in having support for food and housing because I believe everyone should have access to food and affordable housing. A hungry child or elderly should not exist in this modern age age, studies have shown that a hungry child struggles to learn while they're in school. When I arrived to Oregon I suffered from malnutrition due to not having enough access to food. Once I arrived, I received some support with food from the Oregon Food Bank and Snap benefits. My housing insecurities were also omnipresent when I arrived. I struggled to find a home for me and my family at the age of eighteen. I am still struggling wit this to this day.
