



I am writing today as a Principal at Bora Architecture & Interiors in support of House Bill 2141. I urge the committee to support this legislation. As a leader in a firm in Portland that practices in both aspects of the design of the built environment I have observed first hand the special skill set and knowldge that is required of certified Interior Design professionals, and support their recognition as significant contributors to our built environment.
