Given your position as standing lawmakers, it should be no secret that the gun violence epidemic

in America has spun out of control. As a student, I often look to and hope that my government

leaders will choose to take the steps to protect its people. Students should not live in the

unfortunate reality that a potential shooting could take place in their schools; they should not be

hiding in their classrooms or practicing multiple lockdown drills a year. 77% of gun deaths in

Oregon are by gun suicide. Gun violence in Oregon is costly as well – around \$8.1 billion each

year, of which \$89.1 million is paid by taxpayers. You have the power to decrease these rates

with initiatives like Senate Bill 243. By passing this bill, gun manufacturers who exploit gaps in

the law to sell rapid-fire devices will be blocked. By passing this bill, people will have to be 21

to purchase and possess semiautomatic rifles, although 18 - 20 year olds will still be able to

purchase and possess certain firearms for hunting and recreation. By passing this bill, a buffer

period will be mandated before any firearm purchase, creating a crucial waiting period between

temporary suicidal ideation and firearm access. The passing of Senate Bill 243 will foster a safer

place for not only students but all individuals in Oregon.
