The guidelines we have now work well and despite calling Senator Meek's office on 3/27 to understand why this change is being sought, there was no compelling statement or reason that over-rides the current success. We have safer shorelines, erosion prevention and, by extension, preservation of wildlife and the health of this beautiful water. I urge you to leave current guidelines in place and defeat SB301.
