My name is Miriam and I live in Albany and work in Corvallis. I am writing today to support HB 3372. Currently in Oregon it is legal to water a ½ acre garden or use 5,000 gal/day for a commercial purpose, but neither of those apply to growing food and farm products for sale. Local farmers use this water to raise crops to help feed the community through many ways, such as farmers markets, farm stands, wholesale to grocery stores, and wholesale to restaurants. I enjoy this farm to table type of dining at many fine establishments in the area, and it is more sustainable to raise crops locally rather than having them shipped in from overseas which is a big environmental impact.
